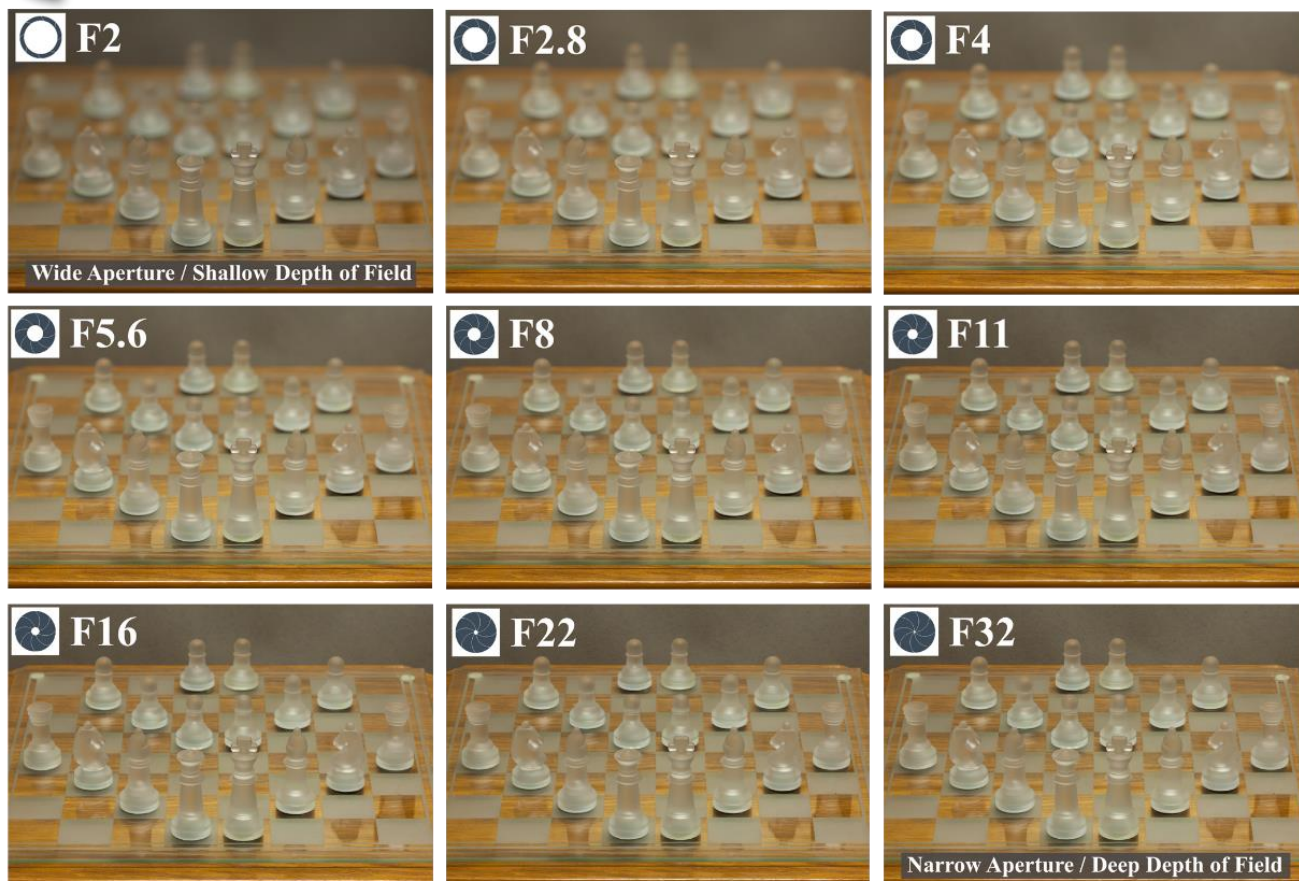




# PHOTOGRAPHY CHEAT SHEET



## APERTURE / DEPTH OF FIELD



Depth of Field (DOF) is the amount of distance between the nearest and farthest objects that are acceptably sharp in a photograph.

The sequence of images above demonstrate that changing your aperture setting increases or decreases the amount of DOF in an image, with a wide aperture (a smaller F number) giving a smaller amount of DOF (area of image acceptably sharp) through to a narrow aperture (a larger F number) giving a larger amount of DOF.
